



Australian Government General Skilled Migration Program - A Guide For Nuclear Medicine Technologists to work in Australia



Step 1: Contact MPRBA

Contact Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia (MRPBA) to obtain information on the process and documents required for registration assessment.

Note: To practise in Australia, practitioners must be registered with the Medical Radiation Practice Board of Australia and meet the Board's registration standards.



Step 2: MRPBA Exam/Supervised Practice

Registration with MRPBA may involve an exam to demonstrate competency and/or a period of supervised practice via the MRPBA Supervised Practice Program.

Note: The exam assesses your knowledge and competencies in medical radiation practice.



Step 3: MRPBA Registration

Once you meet MRPBA registration standards then you will receive your registration number.

Note: A registration number is essential for legally working in the health sector in Australia.



Step 4: Contact ANZSNM

Contact ANZSNM to obtain information on the process and documents required for a Skills Assessment. A fee applies for this assessment.

Note: ANZSNM can only provide advice on applying for a skills assessment. All other questions relating to migration should be directed to the Department of Home Affairs.



Step 5: Contact Department of Home Affairs

Contact the Department of Home Affairs Immigration and Citizenship to obtain the necessary visa to work in Australia.

Note: Ensure you have all the required documents and meet the criteria set by the immigration authorities.

Important: Meeting these requirements does not guarantee employment, but it will make you eligible to work in Australia.
